STATUS

As expected, traffic was backed up on Highway 89 early this morning between Jackson and Moose Junction, but became moderate after the initial rush.

Up-to-date traffic information is being posted on Twitter: @GrandTetonNPS for Grand Teton National Park and @TetonEclipse for general Jackson Hole information.

All federal land management agencies are working on an exit strategy to facilitate traffic flow when the eclipse is over.

Both Teton Interagency Dispatch and Teton County Sheriff's Communication Center reported a number of out-of-bounds camping contacts on Sunday night.

St. John's Medical Center saw a record number of patients in the emergency room for the 24-hour period on Sunday.

GENERAL INFORMATION

WYDOT reports the following statistics: traffic counts statewide increased by more than 27% compared to the five-year average for the third Sunday in August. The counties that saw the largest increases in traffic were Teton at 33,087 more vehicles and Laramie at 44,794 more vehicles.

Teton County had 17,755 more vehicles on Saturday, 13,558 on Friday, 12,157 on Thursday and 10,410 on Wednesday.
